In accordance with Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.420 and the Standards for Access to Electronic Court Records and Access Security Matrix, the Clerk of the Circuit Court is hereby directed to maintain as confidential the following materials related to this matter:

- The following documents within the court file: **Ford Exhibit No. 29: Ford's Subsystem Design Specification applicable to safety belt assemblies**. However, the file and progress docket shall otherwise remain available to the public subject to any substitution of a party's name set forth above.


It is further **ORDERED** that any materials sealed pursuant to this Order shall be conditionally disclosed upon the entry of a further order by this Court finding that such opening is necessary for purposes of judicial or governmental accountability or First Amendment rights.

It is further **ORDERED** that, within 10 days of the date of this Order, the Clerk shall post a copy of this Order on the bulletin board of the Circuit Court of the Sixth Judicial Circuit in and for Pasco County, Florida and the Clerk's website for a period of 30 days to provide public notice.

It is further **ORDERED** that the Clerk is hereby authorized to unseal any materials sealed pursuant to this Order for the purpose of filing, microfilming or imaging files, or transmitting a record to an appellate tribunal. The materials shall be resealed immediately upon completion of the filing.

It is further **ORDERED** that if Ford's Admitted Trial Exhibit No. 29 is filed with the Court or admitted into evidence in any subsequent proceeding involving a party to the Stipulated Protective Order, the filing shall be under seal in accordance with Paragraph 12 of the Stipulated Protective Order, and the filing party shall give advance notice of the filing to the undersigned counsel for Ford.
